

# **Addingham Parish Council – Meeting 15/02/2023**

## **Matters Arising – report for information**

- Data Capture device has been in operation on Main Street. It records vehicle speeds. Cllr Whitaker has now provided data to members.
- The Clerk has expressed a formal interest in a CAT on the car park on Main Street and this has been acknowledged.
- Electrical Installation Condition Report, due at the Pavilion has been undertaken by Gareth Hopwood. A small number of remedial works were identified and these have been authorised by the Clerk and Chairman as a priority.
- School Crossing Patrol manager from BMDC has arranged to visit Addingham on 22<sup>nd</sup> February to look at concerns.
- EVC points have now been powered by Northern Power Grid. The final element of the install is for Npower to connect the meter.
- Bradford have been made aware of illegal tree works on the Old School Site on Chapel Street. There has been a significant amount of professional clearance behind Long Riddings and Bradford have erected signs, stating the land is private and trespassing is not permitted. They do not wish to prevent benign activity, such as dog walking and a common sense approach can be taken by residents.
- Clerk has reported some unauthorised fencing works to BDMC. The fence is on common land (or private land?) close to Big Meadow Drive and it appears that a resident is increasing their private garden space by adding a barrier and identifying it as a wildlife habitat.
- A dangerous tree on Silsden Road, on the A65 roundabout has been removed.
- Addingham United Charities have requested that the Council desists from including maintenance tasks relating to the Dawson Crossley Field, which is rents, on its maintenance log. The charity claims that by doing so, the PC is assuming control, where it has none and misleading the public.
- The first 30 water butts were distributed to residents FOC on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> Feb.
